	Discover the World of Law Students will be able to: • Learn about the purpose of law, including the differences between public and private law • Explore ideas at the intersection of Law & Philosophy
2	Explore the Legal System Students will be able to: • Understand the difference between (and the hierarchy of) criminal and civil courts
3	Understanding Criminal Law Students will be able to: Reflect on some of the ethics involved in working as a criminal defendant Explore what it means to be "guilty beyond reasonable doubt."
4	Debate Human Rights Students will be able to: Explore whether human rights are universal and learn the role of international organisations, such as Amnesty International
5	Big Business and the Law Students will be able to: Explore what happens if a contract is breached Explore different areas of corporate law, Learn how businesses rely on contracts, property and intellectual property law
6	Analyse International Law Students will be able to: • Find out how international bodies like the International Criminal Court resolve famous cases • Explore the role of the UN
7	The History of Law Students will be able to: • Go back in time and see how law has advanced from the ancient period (Egyptians and Babylonians) to eastern traditions (China, India, Islamic world) and the West
8	The Law in Practice and as a career Students will be able to: Explore the paths that lawyers take (barristers and solicitors) Explore the role of judges, courts and parliaments
