3	Plot Development <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Understand the components of a well-structured plot.● Create a plot outline for a short story.	Write a continuation of their story draft. Identify and outline the plot structure of a favourite book or movie.
4	Setting and Worldbuilding <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Create immersive settings for their stories.● Understand the importance of setting in storytelling.	Research settings from different genres and write brief descriptions. Expand on their story setting, adding more detail and depth.
5	Writing Dialogues <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Write realistic and engaging dialogues.● Use dialogue to develop characters and advance the plot.	Record a real-life conversation and adapt it into a dialogue for their story. Practise writing dialogues by creating different scenarios for their characters.
6	Revisiting Genres <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Understand the unique features of various genres.● Experiment with writing in different genres.	Marked: Write a complete short story in a new genre. Read a story from an unfamiliar genre and write a brief analysis.
7	Writing Voice <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Develop a unique writing voice.● Study the writing styles of favourite authors.	Write a short piece in their unique voice and style. Keep a daily journal to



		further develop their writing voice.
8	Editing & Revising <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Revise and edit their work effectively.● Understand the importance of revising and editing.	Continue revising and editing their stories. Write a reflective piece on the revision process and what they learned.
9	Writing your story: Putting it into practice <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Integrate all elements learned to craft a brilliant story.● Finalise their story for the portfolio.	Reflect on their learning journey and document their progress. Organise and compile their portfolio of stories.
10	Presentation & Feedback <i>Students will be able to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Present their completed stories to the class.● Provide and receive constructive feedback.
